

BI-LAWS

CalHauntS By-Laws (abbreviated, 3rd draft, 11/11/06)

CalHauntS' main purpose is to provide monthly workshops at which items are fabricated for use in Halloween/haunt attractions or displays.

CalHauntS shall have no president, secretary or treasurer, and no one individual shall make decisions for the group

CalHauntS shall maintain no treasury and collect no dues. It will remain a pay-as-you-go group in all respects.

CalHauntS workshops shall be organized by a volunteer committee of five members working together (no leader), chosen at random at the September workshop for the following year from a pool of those volunteering. Volunteers for the workshop organizing committee shall have attended at least three workshops in the past year, and shall plan on attending as many as possible as they help us in the coming year.

Anyone is welcome to join CalHauntS and begin receiving group email, but in order to vote when voting is planned, or as the need arises, one must be an active member. An active member is one who has attended at least two workshops in the past year. The November social counts toward this requirement, as do any additional inside workshops if they are designated CalHauntS events (ie: 2005's welding workshop).

The workshop committee shall arrange for volunteer coordinators as it see's fit. For example:

Workshop logistics (a member of the workshop organizing committee)

New members

Potluck

Door prize

CalHauntS members shall disseminate information to each other via an on-line message board and/or website.

A member of CalHauntS can only be removed from the group/message board by a majority vote of the active membership.

CalHauntS workshops shall be provided to its members for the actual cost of materials necessary for the project.

Any member expending his/her funds to purchase goods or services for or on behalf of the group does so at his/her own financial risk if the expenditures have not been authorized in advance by majority vote of the active membership.

Message board moderator(s) shall serve for no more than one consecutive

year.

An online-group owner (in the case of Yahoo Groups) shall serve for no more than two consecutive years.
